## MINUTES Herkimer County Legislature Second Quarter – First Day Wednesday, April 9, 2014 2:00 p.m.

The Second Quarterly Session of the Herkimer County Legislature was called to order by Chairman Vincent Bono at 2:00 p. m.

Chairman Bono called on Bernard Decker, Budget Officer and Purchasing Agent, to lead the Legislature in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Bono then asked County Attorney Malone to give a short report on an article he had received through the New York State Bar Association. The article was written by three SUNY professors concerning municipalities that are fiscally responsible based on their average per capita debt, and Herkimer County ranked number one on their chart. Mr. Malone stated there was another chart concerning the health of the county based on the percent spent on infrastructure and Herkimer County was also ranked as number one, adding that Herkimer County was also mentioned in the article as having their bond rating upgraded by Moody's Investors. Chairman Bono stated that this is a tribute to the county employees who work hard to keep the county running efficiently every day.

Chairman Bono stated that pursuant to Rule 6(12) they would proceed with comments by legislators. The following legislators had further comments: Helen Rose, Robert Hyde, Raymond Johnson and Chairman Bono.
