MINUTES

Herkimer County Legislature First Quarter– First Day Wednesday, January 5, 2011 2:00 p.m.

This Session of the Herkimer County Legislature was called to order by Chairman Raymond Smith at 2:00 p.m.

Chairman Smith called on Ilion Police Chief Tim Parisi to lead the Legislature in the Pledge of Allegiance.
