MINUTES

Herkimer County Legislature Fourth Quarter – Third Day Wednesday, November 16, 2011 7:30 p.m.

The Public Hearing on the Assessment Roll of the Herkimer County Sewer District was called to order at 7:15 p.m. by Bernard Peplinski, Chairman of the Committee on Natural Resources The clerk read the notice of the meeting. Mr. Peplinski asked if there was anyone wishing to speak on the local law. There was one appearance, and the hearing was declared closed at 7:17 p.m.

The Regular Session of the Herkimer County Legislature was called to order by Chairman Raymond Smith at 7:30 p. m.

Chairman Smith led the Legislature in the Pledge of Allegiance and asked for a moment of silence for those that gave their lives in the service of our Country.

REPORT AND RESOLUTION OF THE COMMITTEE ON HUMAN RESOURCES AND THE COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS AMENDING BUDGET IN CONNECTION WITH ADDITIONAL STIMULUS FUNDING FOR THE HERKIMER COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING SERVICE

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 293 duly adopted on November 18, 2009, this Legislature authorized a contract and budget amendment in connection with the receipt of ARRA (American Recovery & Reinvestment Act) funding for increased immunization for adults and children and to improve vaccine storage and handling practices; and
