LOCAL LAW NO. - 2011

A LOCAL LAW INCREASING THE SALARIES OF SOME ELECTED COUNTY OFFICERS AND COUNTY OFFICERS APPOINTED FOR A FIXED TERM DURING THEIR TERM OF OFFICE

- BE IT ENACTED by the Herkimer County Legislature of the County of Herkimer as follows:
- Section 1. The annual salary of the County Sheriff shall be the sum of Fifty Nine Thousand, Five Hundred Forty-Nine Dollars (\$59,549).
- Section 2. The annual salary of the County Treasurer shall be the sum of Fifty One Thousand, Three Hundred Thirty-Two Dollars (\$51,332).
- Section 3. The annual salary of the County Clerk shall be the sum of Fifty-Four Thousand, Two Hundred Fifty-Five Dollars (\$54,255).
- Section 4. The base annual salary of the Commissioner of Social Services shall be the sum of Seventy Eight Thousand, One Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$78,190).
- Section 5. The base annual salary of the County Highway Superintendent shall be the sum of Eighty Five Thousand, Four Hundred Ninety-Nine Dollars (\$85,499).
- Section 6. The base annual salary of the County Administrator shall be the sum of Eighty Five Thousand, Six Hundred Ninety-Six Dollars (\$85,696).
- Section 7. The base annual salary of the County Attorney shall be the sum of Sixty Seven Thousand, Seven Hundred and Eight Dollars (\$67,708).
- Section 8. The base annual salary of the Budget Officer shall be the sum of Fifty Six Thousand and Six Dollars (\$56,006).
- Section 9. The base annual salary of the County Auditor shall be the sum of Fifty Thousand, Three Hundred Ninety Five Dollars (\$50,395).
- Section 10. The base annual salary of the Real Property Tax Director shall be the sum of Forty Six Thousand, Seven Hundred Twenty-Three Dollars (\$46,723).
- Section 11. The base annual salary for the Commissioners of Elections shall be the sum of Thirty Nine Thousand, Eight Hundred Ten Dollars (\$39,810).
- Section 12. The base annual salary of the Personnel Officer/Safety Coordinator shall be the sum of Fifty Eight Thousand, One Hundred Fifty Seven Dollars (\$58,157).
- Section 13. The salary of the County Coroners shall be One Hundred Fourteen Dollars (\$114.00) per call.
- Section 14. This Local Law shall take effect forty-five days after its adoption and shall be subject to a permissive referendum.
