Herkimer County Legislative Chairman, Jim Bono announced important priorities for Herkimer County's future regarding community development. The following was highlighted:

**Herkimer County Community Development Strategic Plan**- The plan was created when the Community Foundation of Herkimer & Oneida Counties, Herkimer County government, and County municipalities, Herkimer County IDA teamed up to sponsor a shared vision for a more prosperous future for Herkimer County. Formal Announcement of the Community Development Director- In October of 2022, the County announced the appointment of Deborah Kessler as its Community Development Director, who is charged with implementing the County's 2022 Community Development Strategic Plan. Kessler is no stranger to community involvement. She serves on the following board of directors; Central Association for the Blind & Visually Impaired, Empowered Pathways, and the Herkimer Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors.

She also works part-time as an entrepreneur by operating her own promotions, consulting and marketing company. Kessler has a Bachelor of Science in Public Relations from the former Utica College.

Appointment of the Advisory Committee – In January 2023 an advisory committee was formed made up of non-profits, education, business and government leaders. Their role is to guide our countywide priorities and action and help build new systems for collaboration alongside the development director. Members are as follows:

Community Development Summit slated for May 4, 2023 – The advisory board and Kessler are working on a Community Development Summit slated for May 4, at Herkimer College from 8:30AM to 12:30PM. It is free and open to the public. The Herkimer County Community Development Summit will bring together leaders from across Herkimer County to hear findings of our first countywide community development study and plan, celebrate successes and innovative projects, and develop a collaborative action agenda for 2023. We are asking community members to join us to build connections, shape actions for local communities and countywide community development action, and share ideas.

#### DID YOU KNOW???

#### ROUNDABOUT INTERSECTION OF CHOICE

There are several benefits of roundabouts over traditional intersections with traffic signals and stop signs. With input from a January article in "The Villages Daily Sun" Florida newspaper, here is more information showing the safety features and other pluses of roundabouts.

Armed with mounting data touting the benefits of roundabouts, experts are persuading communities to do what The Villages and Carmel, IN, have already done – rely on geometry rather than just signs and traffic lights to keep traffic moving safely and efficiently. Carmel lays claim to "The Roundabout Capital of America – they have over 130 of them. The Villages is probably second with 45. Here are four reasons why Carmel is so big on roundabouts.

- Since the 1990s Carmel has been replacing intersections with roundabouts because of their safety record, their compatibility with the environment and their ability to make navigation easier for pedestrians and bicyclists.
- ⇒ Since Carmel began constructing roundabouts to replace traffic signals and 4-way stops, the number of collisions with injuries has dropped by about 80%.
- ⇒ Less time spent idling has led to significant gasoline savings. A study conducted by the city on 10 roundabouts found an annual average savings of 24,000 gallons, with one site saving about 47,000 gallons.
- ⇒ Carmel police studied the average cost of crash damages at four intersections in 2006. The average cost of damages for the two roundabouts was \$3,000 and \$3,500. For the two signalized intersections it was \$7,335 and \$13,561.

Roundabouts are safer because they have only eight "conflict points" compared to 32 for traditional intersections. Safety is the top factor. In roundabouts most collisions are fender benders versus T-bone or head-on crashes in traditional intersections.

Data from 12 intersections between 2012 and 2018 in The Villages, compiled by Lake Sumter Metropolitan Planning Organization – six roundabouts and six signalized intersections - tell another powerful story.

In that six-year period, there were 538 total collisions at the six signalized intersections, resulting in 160 injuries and five fatalities. Two of those fatalities came from left-turn collisions, a scenario improbable in a roundabout.

Meanwhile, the six roundabout intersections reported 306 incidents with 49 injuries and a single fatality. An estimated \$2.9 million in damages occurred at the six signalized intersections, while only \$877,000 was documented at the six roundabout intersections, according to the information in The Villages Daily Sun.

Roundabouts can handle 30-50 % more traffic than other intersections, according to U.S.DOT figures.

Like them or not, roundabouts are here to stay. In NYS, as in Florida, DOT engineers are mandated to consider a roundabout whenever there are new intersections or reconstruction of existing traditional intersections. Initially, some drivers may have a negative attitude toward roundabouts, probably because they aren't sure how to navigate them. But attitudes tend to shift with familiarity, and once drivers have maneuvered a roundabout and become familiar with them, they learn to like them. Go roundabouts!


support the campuses. While at Herkimer, Chancellor King toured the campus and met with elected officials, college leaders, faculty, and students.

# Herkimer College to offer the first Esports Management A.A.S. degree in New York State



to be offered in New York State.

Esports, which involves professional or semi-professional competitive gaming in an organized format, is a billion-dollar industry and has seen tremendous growth in recent years, both in terms of viewership and revenue. As a result, the need for managers to support this industry is also projected to increase.

According to Insider Intelligence, in the year 2022, there were 532 million esports viewers worldwide. The industry has seen a huge increase in investment from venture capitalists and private equity firms. These investments are distributed to players, tournament operators, and digital broadcasters.

"This is an exciting time for Herkimer College with the addition of Esports Management to our academic program portfolio," President Cathleen C. McColgin, Ph.D. shares. "This is not only an opportunity for students to transform a passion for gaming into a dynamic career, but it also positions graduates in the forefront of a rapidly emerging, multi-billion dollar industry."

The degree program will enable graduates to enter the workforce upon graduation or continue their education at a four-year college or university. Graduates can expect to find employment in events management, broadcasting, facilities, game day management and operations, public relations, marketing, and sales.

Herkimer College Business professor Steven Boucher says, "what is unique about our program is that it not only prepares students in esports management, event planning, and sports governance, but it provides learners with a critical business foundation, providing for unlimited opportunities."

Herkimer College has been in step with the esports trend, creating the Generals esports athletic program in 2020. The College is one of approximately 81 institutions nationwide competing in the National Junior College Athletic Association Esports (NJCAAE), comprised of over 600 specific teams and 1,500 plus student-athletes nationwide. In the five seasons of competition, Herkimer College's esports team has won a national championship in *Call of Duty Gunfight*, as well as three top-four finishes and a top-eight in various gaming disciplines.

- Every dog and cat needs two rabies vaccinations, one year apart, then once every three years.
- Bring proof of the pet's vaccination history to receive a three-year certificate.
- Ferrets must be vaccinated every year.
- Dogs must be on a leash. Cats and ferrets must be in a carrier or pillowcase.
- No vet exams will be given.
- Owners are responsible to clean up after their animals. Supplies are provided.
- A \$5.00 donation per pet is suggested to defray costs.
